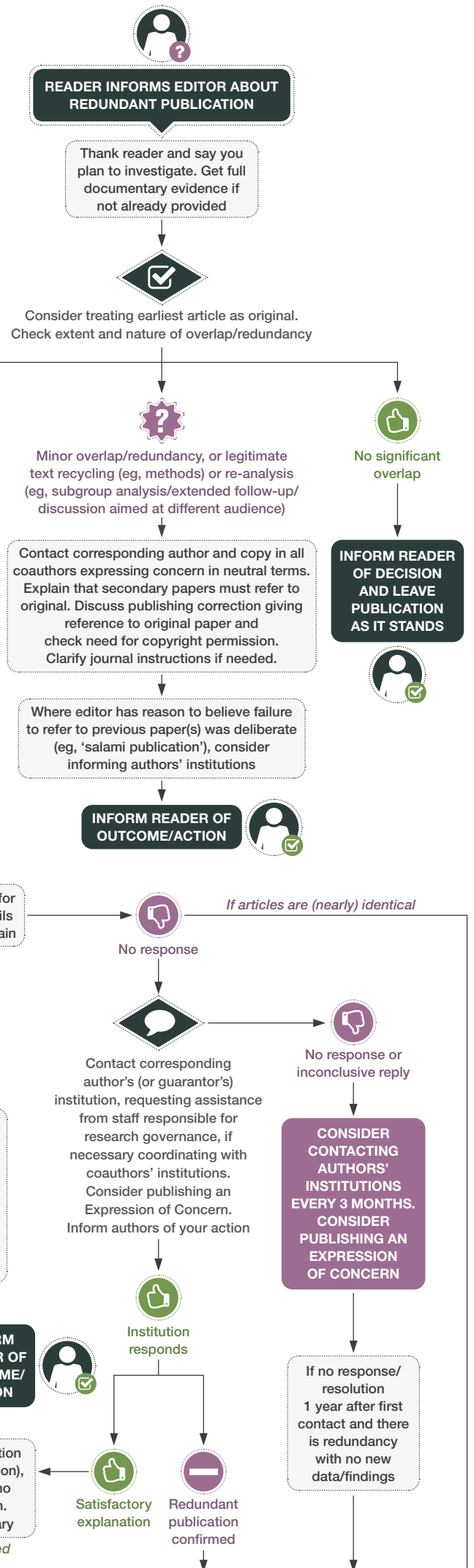


REDUNDANT (DUPLICATE) PUBLICATION
IN A PUBLISHED ARTICLE

Notes

- The instructions to authors should state the journal's policy on redundant publication.
- To help in future investigations, ask authors at submission stage to verify that their manuscript is original and has not been published elsewhere.
- For cases involving completely different sets of authors, refer to COPE Flowchart: 'Plagiarism in a published article' - <https://doi.org/10.24318/cope.2019.2.2>
- International Committee of Medical Journal Editors advises that translations are acceptable but **MUST** reference the original. Editors may consider publishing a correction (ie, the link to the original article) and checking the need for copyright permission rather than a retraction in such cases.
